



Funds for unforeseen events

Funds from the budget program "Funds for unforeseen events" (hereinafter - FUE) are allocated for measures of special national importance, expenses not foreseen in the appropriations of the state basic budget for the prevention of the consequences of disasters and natural disasters and compensation for the losses caused by them, and other contingencies. Funds from the FUE program are requested by ministries or other government funded central state institutions.

In the "Law on the state budget for 2024 and budget framework for 2024, 2025 and 2026¹" for the program 02.00.00 FUE has been allocated **119.2 million euro for 2024**.

In the second quarter of this year, 22 institutional requests for the allocation of financial resources from the FUE program were approved. The total amount of these requests was 3.1 million euro. Thus, 2.6% of the funding planned for this program was used in the second quarter, while in the first half of this year, a total of 6.6% of the funding planned in the program for 2024 was used. In the first two quarters of this year and in the previous year, the use of FUE resources was significantly more economical than in 2022, when the Covid-19 pandemic crisis was taking place, and fiscal restrictions were not in effect. The amount of FUE by institution is shown in Table 1.
